Subj: PRESIDENT'S 2017 REPORT ON THE STATE OF THE CPOA

- 1. As required by the CPOA Operations Manual, report is submitted to the Association's membership.
- 2. **MEMBERSHIP:** Currently, the CPOA/CGEA membership stands at 9793 (8251 CPOA / 1542 CGEA), with 10 new Silver Lifetime Members. Since I August 2016, our Association has welcomed the River City, Elm City and Eastern Shore Branches, and our Association will proudly institute the Derby City Slugger Chapter (Louisville, KY) at the 2017 Convention.

3. FINANCIAL ISSUES:

- a. Our Association closed out FY-2016 with a surplus of \$9,735 and, as of this date, FY-2017 is on course to be solidly in the black. Many thanks to CPOA Treasurer, CWO Mark Tahtinen, for his outstanding efforts in drafting the proposed annual budget.
- b. 1. This report is submitted to notify you of the state of our National Office.

NATIONAL OFFICE

a. Continue to optimize and update both the Executive Director and Membership Coordinator SOP's.

EIN MANAGEMENT

- a. Of the 54 EIN's revoked in 2012 by the IRS, 52 have been reinstated, 2 have been re-issued.
- b. Submitted annual 990-N for all Chapters and Branches with active EIN's.

COMPUTER SYSTEM

- a. The MC's new computer system and software are running properly. All other computer systems and the membership database are running as required.
- b. Weekly computer backups are conducted to ensure database integrity.

WEBSITE

a. Our Wordpress website went online just over a year ago. We've experienced a few minor bugs which our webmasters continue to address.

ACCOUNTING

- a. Continue to utilize Quickbooks Online Essentials. National Treasurer has access to ensure continued transparency and oversight.
- b. Yearly taxes submitted on time.
- c. Continue to work closely with the Budget Committee and the BOD to optimize our annual budget based upon actual expenditures.

CCCAF

a. CCCAF information was published in the January edition of "The Chief" and posted on our website and e-newsletter. Received and processed 15 applications and provided to CCCAF Chairman for grading. President sent the congratulatory letter to the winners (3) and the scholarship "Big Checks" were mailed for presentation. Letters of acknowledgement were sent to all individuals who participated in this year's program.

COMMUNICATION

- a. The Chief:
 - Membership Coordinator continues to attend to our transient members in our database. The July issue of The Chief resulted in 18 magazines returned, down from a high of 457 in 2011-2012.

b. E-Newsletter:

- Presently sending to over 9,000 contacts, up from 8,100 last year.
- Still receiving above average open rates (38.0%) and click through rates (27.0%). Similar industry rates (non-profit organizations) are 24.5% and 15.4% respectively.

c. Facebook:

- The CPOA Facebook page remains a valuable communication platform to quickly spread awareness about key issues, mobilize supporters, raise funds, and create online advocacy movements. The page has 3,416 followers, up from 3011 last year. Our average reach is 12,000 people per month.
- The CGEA Facebook page managed by CGEA members presently has 1,120 followers (up from 890 last year).
- d. LinkedIn:
 - Presently has 2,020 members, up from 1495 last year.
- e. Twitter:
 - Presently has 460 followers, up from 390 last year.
- f. Mobile App:
 - Still available to members.

THE MILITARY COALITION (TMC)

- a. Continue to serve as the TMC's Treasurer.
- b. Published 2016 legislative victories in our e-newsletter.
- c. We signed on to 11 Coalition letters since August 2016, all of which can be found on the TMC website which is linked to our e-newsletter.
- d. 2017 legislative goals published in our e-newsletter.
- e. Continue to work closely with Coalitions' communication committee to improve our outreach. With over 5.5 million combined members, having a social media strategy could substantially increase our strength and influence.

TMC continues to increase its reputation on the Hill. With the transition to a new administration in D.C., many organizations have been focusing on introducing the Coalition to new members of Congress and staffers.

MEMBERSHIP

- a. We presently have 8251 CPOA members and 1542 CGEA members (a decrease of 65 from last year).
- b. Since 1 July 2016, the MC has opened 645 new memberships (334 CPOA & 311 CGEA).
- c. Since 1 July 2016, 225 of our members Crossed the Bar.
- d. The MC will mail 25-year pins to 181 eligible members this year.

STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS

a. USAA – Continues to provide \$10,000 as part of our annual partnership compensation. They are also sending a quarterly affinity check averaging \$1,200 and provided \$1,500 to CCCAF last year. We are under contract with USAA until August 2021.

OTHER

- a. In November, we represented the CPOA at the Veterans Day National Ceremony held at Arlington National Cemetery where 4 members placed a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and 2 members from the Baltimore Chapter paraded the CPOA & American flags in the amphitheatre before and after the ceremony. Our National President was welcomed to the White House for the annual breakfast hosted by the President.
- b. The Board approved a new approach in increasing membership at the Chief's Acadamy. We developed professional produced pocket folders with small membership booklets and pens to be provided at the Chapter sponsored spaghetti dinner social. It is believed that this more direct approach to newly pinned Chiefs will assist the Petaluma Chapter in increasing National's overall membership numbers.
- c. Any Chapter interested in utilizing these booklets for membership drives can contact the National Office and we'll send them. If the use of the booklets becomes sucessessful, we would develop similar booklets for the CGEA.
- 2. This has been another great year at National. Financially, we closed out FY 2016 \$9,735 under budget. Pending any unforeseen expenditures, I expect us to be solidly in the black in 2017. We welcomed three new Branches since I August 2017 (River City, Elm City, and Eastern Shore), and one Chapter (Derby City Slugger). I am honored to be starting my 6th year serving as your Executive Director and greatly appreciate your continuing support.

 - c. Reach out to CG unit ESO's to include on their distribution lists
- 3. The committee also discussed additional fundraising efforts to insure the scholarship meets it's funding requirement annually. The committee recommends placement of a poster or placard on a table during opening ceremonies advertising the scholarships and a donation jar/receptacle for members to contribute. This allows members who attend the earlier portion of convention but may not be around for closing ceremonies the opportunity to contribute and increase awareness of the scholarships.
- 4. The committee discussed and created two essay questions for this coming year's contests.
- 5. For the CCCAF Scholarship, the question recommended is: "Recently Confederate monuments have been removed in New Orleans. Should these monuments be removed nationwide? "Why or why not, please support your position.
- 6. For the Walt Gore Scholarship, the question recommended is: "As budgets become more constrained, should specific Coast Guard missions be privatized in an effort to stop doing more with less?" If so, which missions and why? If not please support your position?

2017 LONG RANGE PLANNING CONVENTION COMMITTEE REPORT

- 1. The Long Range Planning Convention Committee met on August 8, 2017 discussed and recommends the following:
 - a. Determine if an increase in CPOA membership dues will be required in the next 2-3 years to maintain the financial health of the organization.
 - (1) Met with the National Treasurer, CWO Mark Tahtinen to the review the historical and current financial data.
 - (2) After meeting with CWO Tahtinen, the committee identified no indication that an increase in membership dues needs to take place in the next year or two.
 - (3) Recommendations: The committee recommends that annually, at convention, an evaluation shall be made to determine if an increase to future membership dues is needed to maintain the financial health of the CPOA.
 - b. Trial change of convening month of the CPOA National Convention.
 - (1) In an attempt to bring more members to Convention we propose a three year trial change to the month Convention is held. The assumption that more people may be able to attend Convention in a month further from typical transfers season and with lower costs for hotel and convention services, because of off peak spring rates.
 - (2) Recommendations: Conventions shall be held, beginning with the 2019 50th Anniversary Celebration, in April until April 2021.
 - (3) At the 2021 National Convention a decision will be made whether to permanently change future Conventions in April. This decision shall be based upon attendance, real cost savings, and member feedback.
 - c. CGEA membership booklet.
 - (1) Create a compressive membership booklet similar to the newly created CPOA booklet, to enhance the recruiting of new CGEA members.
 - (2) REQUEST \$2000 IN SUDGET FOR THIS ITEM.

 d. Continue to investigate the possibility of holding the CPOA and CGEA conventions at the same time and at the same location with other enlisted associations (such as NCOA, FRA,) to lower costs for hotel and convention services.
