PRESIDENT'S 2018 FINAL REPORT ON THE STATE OF THE CPOA

- 1. As required by the CPOA Operations Manual, this report is submitted to our Association's membership.
- 2. MEMBERSHIP: Our Association's total membership is 9791. The CPOA membership stands at 8088, including 11 new Silver Lifetime Members, and the CGEA membership is now 1703. Since 1 August 2017, our Association has welcomed the new Traverse City Chapter, and four CGEA Branches: South Texas and TISCOM, Oregon Coast and Bottled in Bond. A huge THANK YOU goes out to DC1 Mike Lewis and YN1 Carly Beer ~ their recruiting efforts and enthusiasm for the CGEA have resulted in the addition of an incredible 29 new CGEA Branches over the past six years!

### 3. FINANCIAL ISSUES:

- a. Our Association closed out FY-2017 with a surplus of \$134. The CPOA's total valuation is \$1,017,292 (\$747,322 in Checking/Savings/CDs and \$269,970 in assessed real property). As of this date, FY-2018 is on course to be solidly in the black. Many thanks to CPOA Treasurer, CWO Mark Tahtinen, for his outstanding efforts in drafting the proposed annual budget.
- b. The Triennial Financial Review has been completed by Zukerman & Associates and the results found the CPOA's finances to be in good order and in compliance with all applicable accounting practices.

## 4. CAPT Caliendo College Assistance Fund (CCCAF) & Walt Gore Memorial Scholarship (WGMS):

- a. The three scholarship winners for the 2018 CCCAF Scholarships were: \$5000 First Place to Ms. Sophia Masson, daughter of PAC John Masson (North Coast); \$2500 Second Place to Mr. Ian McQueen, son of CWO4 Donald McQueen (Kleckner); and \$1000 Third Place to Ms. Destiny Harris, daughter of AMTCM Kit Harris (Mobile). Many thanks to the CCCAF Chair MKCS (Ret) JD Warren, who ran a flawless program once again, and to Committee Members who read all of the submissions for the CCCAF & WGMS: SKC Anthony Lim, OSCS John Hurley, CWO2 Tamara Heckel, SKC Brandon Bove, OSC Rebecca Unser, YNC David Isbell, BMC Travis Sanders and SK1 Jamie Bridges.
- b. The 2018 awardees of the inaugural Walt Gore Memorial Scholarship were CGEA members BM2 Benjamin Lind and YN1 Carey Bounds. The CCCAF Standing Committee Chair continues to encourage all members of the CPOA and CGEA who are pursuing college or graduate degrees to apply for this program.

a. All computer systems and the membership database are running as required.

b. ED conducts weekly computer backups, MC conducts daily backups to ensure database integrity.

### WEBSITE

a. Our Wordpress website went online just over 2 years ago. We've experienced a few minor bugs which our webmasters continue to address.

### **ACCOUNTING**

- a. Continue to utilize Quickbooks Online Essentials. National Treasurer has access to ensure continued transparency and oversight.
- b. Yearly taxes submitted on time.
- c. Continue to work closely with the Budget Committee and the BOD to optimize our annual budget based upon actual expenditures.
- d. Financial review was conducted (every three years), no discrepancies were noted.

### <u>CCCAF</u>

a. CCCAF information was published in the January edition of "The Chief" and posted on our website and e-newsletter. Received and processed 31 applications and provided to CCCAF Chairman for grading. President sent the congratulatory letter to the winners (3) and the scholarship "Big Checks" were mailed for presentation. Letters of acknowledgement were sent to all individuals who participated in this year's program.

### **COMMUNICATION**

- a. The Chief:
  - Membership Coordinator continues to attend to our transient members in our database. The July issue of The Chief resulted in 18 magazines returned, down from a high of 457 in 2011-2012.
- b. E-Newsletter:
  - Presently sending to over 9,000 contacts.
  - Still receiving above average open rates (39.0%) and click through rates (19.0%). Similar industry rates (non-profit organizations) are 24.5% and 15.4% respectively.
- c. Facebook:
  - The CPOA Facebook page remains a valuable communication platform to quickly spread awareness about key issues, mobilize supporters, raise funds, and create online advocacy movements. The page has 3,893 followers, up from 3,416 last year. Our average reach is 12,000 people per month.
  - The CGEA Facebook page managed by CGEA members presently has 1,131 followers (up from 1,120 last year).
- d. LinkedIn:
  - Presently has 2,163 members, up from 2,020 last year.
- e. Twitter:
  - Presently has 503 followers, up from 460 last year.

- a. USAA Continues to provide \$10,000 as part of our annual partnership compensation. They are also sending a quarterly affinity check averaging \$1,200 and provided \$1,500 to CCCAF last year. We are under contract with USAA until August 2021.
- 2. This has been another great year at National. Financially, we closed out FY 2017 \$134 under budget. Pending any unforeseen expenditures, I expect us to be solidly in the black in 2018. We welcomed two new Branches since 1 August 2017 (TISCOM and South Texas, Bottled In Bond, and Oregon Coast), and one Chapter (Traverse City). I am honored to be starting my 7<sup>th</sup> year serving as your Executive Director and greatly appreciate your continuing support.

### CPOA National Board of Directors Resolution to Amend the By-Laws #1 SECTION IX - Amendments and Revisions to the By-Laws

WHEREAS: Only a small percentage of CPOA members in good standing attend the Annual Convention;

WHEREAS: The number of members who attend the Annual CPOA Convention is insufficient to provide a true representation of our membership;

WHEREAS: It is in the best interests of the Association to include as many members' voices as possible in the

deliberative process when conducting the business of the CPOA;

THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED:

That Section IX, Amendment and Revisions to the By-Laws, of the CPOA By-Laws be replaced in its entirety with the following

Resolutions to Amend the By-Laws.

Only the CPOA Board of Directors, a CPOA Chapter or a CPOA Member in Good Standing may submit a

Resolution to Amend the CPOA By- Laws (Resolution).

Resolutions which are submitted by a CPOA Chapter or Member must be received at the CPOA National Office to arrive not later than 120 days prior to the convening of that year's Annual Convention. The submitter may send a Resolution via postal mail, email or fax.

The CPOA Vice President shall review all submitted Resolutions to ensure alignment with all other portions

of By-Laws and present his/her findings to the CPOA Board of Directors.

(1) If the CPOA Board of Directors determines that a Resolution is out of order, it will be returned to the submitter with an explanation for its return.

The CPOA Board of Directors shall vote to recommend approval or disapproval of a Resolution within 30

days of receipt.

e. The Resolution, including the Board of Directors recommendation, will then be forwarded to the CPOA Chapter Presidents, and they shall provide their vote to recommend approval or disapproval of the Resolution to the CPOA National President by not later than 45 days prior to the convening of that year's Convention.

f. The Resolution will then be put before the CPOA Members in Good Standing and in attendance at the Annual Convention for approval or disapproval; approval by a two-thirds (2/3) majority is required of those present and voting.

g. An approved Resolution will become effective upon the adjournment of the Convention in which it was

approved.

h. Resolutions shall be submitted in writing, in accordance with the following guidance; that is:

(1) Each Resolution shall be restricted to one subject.

(2) The WHEREAS(S) section shall state the reason(s) for the proposal.

(3) The RESOLVED section shall contain the exact wording of the proposal to be adopted.

(4) All Resolutions submitted shall contain the following statement:

(a) For a Resolution submitted by the CPOA Board of Directors: "This is to certify that on (date), with a quorum present at a regularly scheduled or special meeting, this Resolution to Amend the CPOA By-Laws was proposed, read, debated, and adopted by a majority (or unanimous) vote of the CPOA National Board of Directors.'

(b) For a Resolution submitted by a CPOA Chapter: "This is to certify that on (date), with a quorum present at a regular scheduled or special meeting, this Resolution to Amend the CPOA By-Laws was proposed, read, debated, and adopted by a majority (or unanimous) vote of the Chapter Members in Good Standing." The Chapter President shall sign the Resolution on behalf the of Chapter

(c) No certification is required if the Resolution is submitted by an individual CPOA Member.

This is to certify that on 7 December 2017, with a quorum present at a regularly scheduled meeting, this Resolution to Amend the CPOA By-Laws was proposed, read, debated, and adopted by a unanimous vote of the CPOA National Board of Directors.

Motions to Amend the Operations Manual.

(1) A Motion to Amend the Operations Manual shall be submitted to the National Board of Directors to arrive not later than 120 days prior to the convening of that year's Annual Convention. The Board of Directors shall vote to recommend approval or disapproval of the Motion to Amend within 30 days of receipt, and a statement supporting the Board's recommendation shall be published in the July edition of The Chief magazine and placed on the CPOA Website.

(2) The Motion to Amend, with the Board of Director's recommendation, will then be presented to the CPOA Chapter Presidents for their consideration and their vote recommending approval or disapproval of the Motion.

(3) The Motion to Amend the Operations Manual will then be put before the CPOA members in good standing and in attendance at the Annual Convention for approval or disapproval; approval by a simple majority plus one (51%) is required of those present and voting.

(4) And approved Amendment will become effective upon the adjournment of the Convention in which it was

approved.

When a main motion is of such importance or length as to be in writing, it shall be written in the form of a d. resolution. That is:

(1) Each Motion shall be restricted to one subject.

(2) The WHEREAS(S) shall state the reasons for the proposal.
 (3) The RESOLVED shall contain the exact wording of the proposal to be adopted.

(4) Proposed Motion shall contain the following: "This is to certify that on (date), with a quorum present at a regular scheduled or special meeting this Motion was proposed, read, debated, adopted and signed by majority (or unanimous) vote." If the Motion is being made by an individual member, this certification is not required and the member shall sign and date the Motion.

The number of people actually responding to a call for any particular meeting must meet or exceed the quorum of members and these responders shall be assumed present until the meeting is adjourned; however, in meetings where members are expected to be continuously present (e.g., telephone or video conferences) the quorum of members who respond must remain connected during the course of the business portion of the meeting.

(d) Electronic Voting. Voting via email or by Electronic Ballot Module during meetings for the purpose of adoption shall contain identification and authentication information identifying the voter; member's name and verifiable members email address shall be sufficient. Audio and/or video meetings may use voice vote provided

there is sufficient certainty that each responder is on the official roll of voting members.

(e) Procedural rules related to the conduct of electronic meetings shall be established and promulgated by the Board of Directors
